LOGLINE:

When a dog owner leaves his window open, Lupito and Hank the Tank decide to make their escape and attempt to taste Delicious Forbidden Human Pizza.

THEME:

You can do anything you set your mind to, as long as you're willing to get a little silly with it.

SYNOPSIS:

Lupito the Chihuaha and Hank (the Tank) (The French Bulldog) begin their adventure when their owner, Brandon, leaves his apartment window open on the way out the door. The delicious smell of cooking food from the pizza place across the street tempts the dogs into making a daring escape. Their path is blocked by an irate waiter, Antoin, who takes the "no pets allowed" sign on the door very seriously. Lupito and Hank try bribing and then intimidating Antoin, but to no avail. The dogs are stumped until Lupito spots a long coat and a hat that a previous patron had left behind. Perfect! The dogs climb on top of each other and sneak into the restaurant using their Very Convincing Human Disguise. They almost get to have a bite, but victory is snatched from their paws when Hank gets too excited and blows their cover. The dogs flee back to the apartment to sulk, but Brandon returns with a surprise: he got pizza for everyone! Everybody gets to enjoy a meal together and take a long nap after an exciting day.

This film pitch is intended for families/general audiences.


CHARACTER: LUPITO

He is excitable, scheming, and bouncy.






CHARACTER: HANK







CHARACTER: ANTOIN, THE WAITER



CHARACTER: BRANDON, THE OWNER




WORLD: POP-POP'S PIZZA

A modest, but comfortable apartment complex, perfect for Brandon's family of three. It gets a lot of natural light, too!




WORLD: THE CITY

Brandon says goodbye to the dogs, leaving the window just a crack open. The adventure begins!






After a few failed attempts, the dogs manage to sneak in to the restaurant using a human disguise. Will they get away with it?

WHY ANIMATION?

The story may be fictional, but the joy that these dogs have brought to me, my Uncle Brandon, and everyone else they met is very real.
